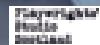

It's January 25, 1797, in the quiet graveyard of Dumfries, and Agnes Broun is remembering her recently departed son, Robert Burns. The two women, bound by a shared history and unresolved tensions, clash as they come face-to-face.

Unbeknownst to them, a mysterious figure watches from the shadows – Clarinda, Burns' muse and soulmate, who has brought

a dram to honour her beloved Rabbie.

Featuring Burns' timeless songs and poetry, including *My Love Is Like a Red, Red Rose*, *Ae Fond Kiss*, and *Auld Lang Syne*.

This dynamic new musical play explores the life of Robert Burns through the perspectives of the three women who knew him best. It highlights how these often-overlooked figures shaped the legacy and contributed to the art of Scotland's greatest poet.

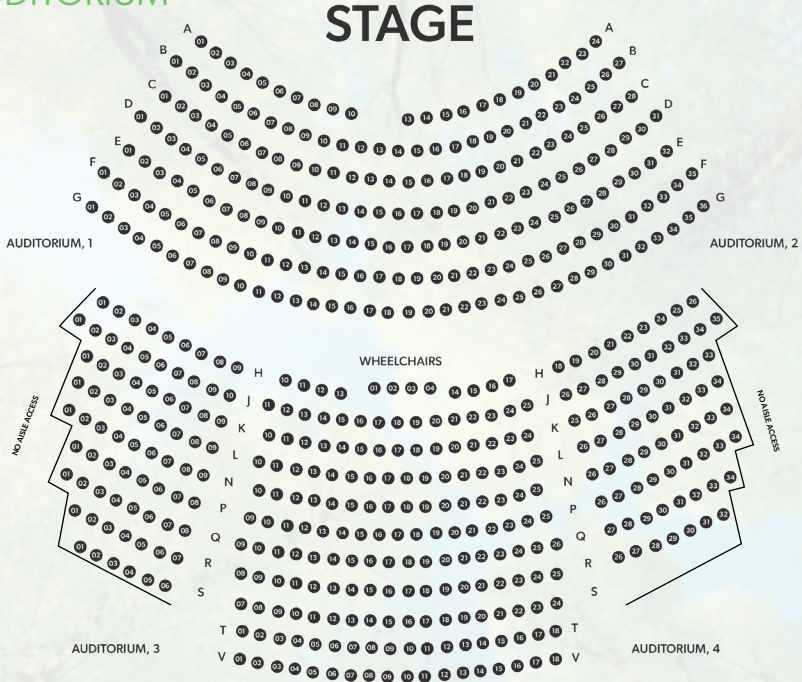

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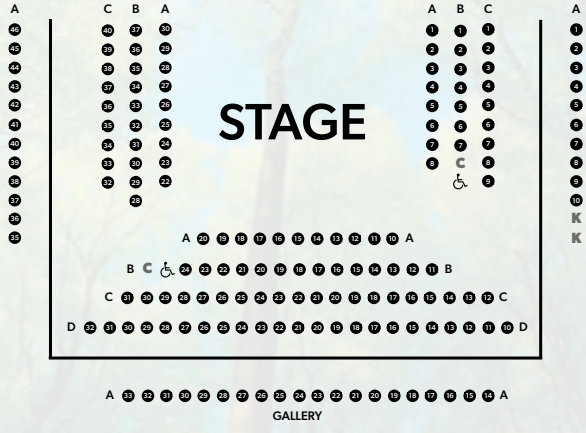
